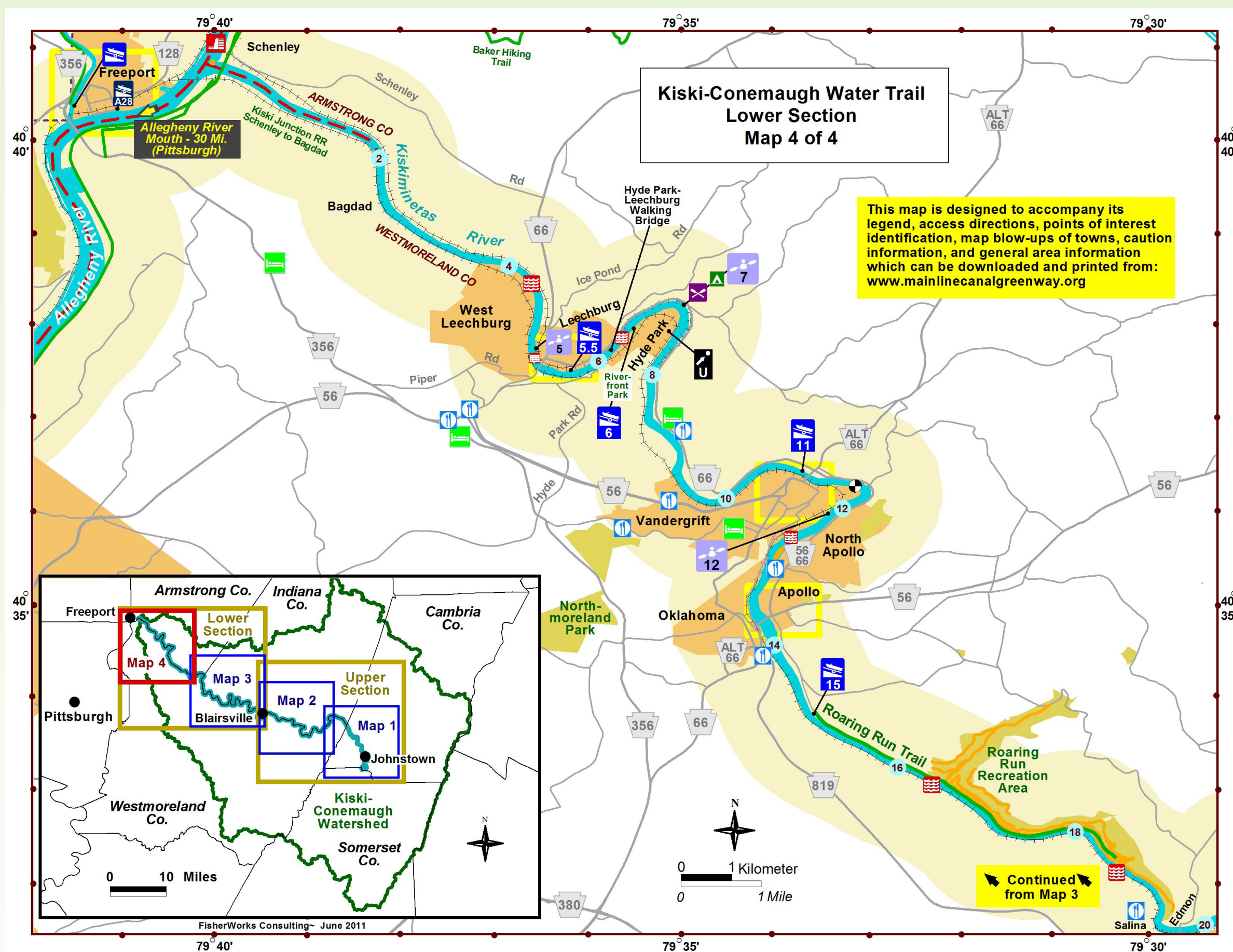

Apollo was originally known as Warren, or “Warren’s Sleeping Place,” for 1730s Native American trader Edward Warren, although local legend credits the name to a mythical Native American chief allegedly buried there. Warren was laid out in 1816 and consisted of 50 lots. Four log structures made up the first homes built in Warren. Drake Log Cabin is a historic 1-1/2 story log cabin that was restored in 1971 and still stands today. The area was officially renamed from Warren to Apollo in 1848 to avoid confusion with the post office of another town in Pennsylvania of the same name. The present name is after Apollo, the Greek and Roman god of music, healing, light, prophecy, and enlightenment. Canal remnants and coal mining artifacts can be found along the mountain biking, hiking, and rail trails of the nearby Roaring Run Recreation Area.
